## Announcements/Administration

- Meeting called to order at 10:12 a.m. by Carla Hawkins; due to absence of quorum, Tom Rossman entered motion to adjourn, which was seconded by Steven Vest; attendees remained for general discussion and presentations by scheduled guest presenters.
- Additional members subsequently arrived and quorum requirement was met; meeting re-called to order at 10:31 a.m. by Carla Hawkins.
- Meeting minutes from 6/4/13 (Handout) were reviewed; motion entered by Roger Recktenwald to adopt the minutes; second motion entered by Will Holmes; all members approved and minutes were passed as written.

## Kentucky Aerial Photography & Elevation Data Program (KYAPED) – Kent Anness

- Data for 2013 project year is currently under active review; additional volunteers for review process are needed.
- Projected project area for 2014 = \$894,535 including potential funding and partnerships with the National Resources Conservation Service, Tennessee Valley Authority, Division of Abandoned Mine Lands, US Geological Survey.
- Brief discussion included potential solicitation for financial support from private entities; e.g. large natural gas pipeline project will involve multiple private interests with a large need for parcel data.
- *KYTC Minute*, is a new weekly video feature developed and published by the Kentucky Transportation Cabinet; the 8/29/13 highlights the uses of LiDAR.

## Guest Presentation: ArcGIS Server Search Services (Kentucky Transportation Cabinet) – Jeremy Gould

- As an answer to meeting KYTC user needs, the cabinet began utilizing this service which has been valuable in promoting data awareness, and allows users to determine whether specific data exists, how to find it, etc.
- Demonstration included how to easily set up the service and use it to quickly search maps, data and/or tools, as well as a fast, easy way to obtain metadata. Located directly on the desktop, allowing users to add data directly from the search results.

## Guest Presentation: Select Kentucky (Cabinet for Economic Development) – William McDowell & Jenny Schenkenfelder

- As the primary state agency responsible for creating new jobs and building the state's economy, the cabinet wanted a new, unique look and feel that is easy to use by non-GIS professionals across the globe. The cabinet contracted with the COT Office of Application Development, including the Division of Geographic Information to develop the site. In June 2013, the *Select Kentucky* site was launched as a result of this one-year project.
- Site demo included the multiple search functionality available through the site, including map results, as well as text, and allows four searches to be consolidated in a single place; extensive and easy to use search criteria

includes local parameters; additional tools allow users to “draw and measure” and calculate drive times; search results can be saved and/or exported; data is updated daily, and the site is compatible with mobile devices.

- ADDs frequently provide professional staff support, including GIS resources; specific GIS resources vary from one ADD to another and are valuable to units of government that often are unable to afford them otherwise.

**Standards Committee Update – *Will Holmes, Chair***

Committee continues to work toward clearly defining 10-15 parcel attributes, a subset of parcel data, to use in a proposal for data sharing between state agencies and PVAs.

**Outreach Committee Update – *Roger Recktenwald, Chair***

- Progress continues on local government analysis to identify the ways in which these entities use GIS; approximately 60% of counties have been surveyed.
- Committee seeking participation and support from council members to assist in developing a new committee “agenda.”

**Division of Geographic Information (DGI) Update – *Tom Rossman, Director***

- Two new base map layers have been released, including Streets (cached down to the street level by KYTC) and the 2012 KYAPED imagery; both are available via all services – instructions on how to connect are available on the KyGeoNet (<http://kygeonet.ky.gov>).
- Layer for alternative fueling sites to be developed from existing source data.

**New Business/Final Notes:**

- New CORS stations recently added – Cumberland Gap Station (KYCG) and Paducah Station (KYPD).
- Next council meeting – December 3
